IN THE MATTER OF an application, submitted by the Department of Parks and Recreation pursuant to Sections 197-c and 199 of the New York City Charter, for an amendment to the City Map involving:

- the establishment of a park between Major Deegan Boulevard and the Harlem River; and
- any acquisition or disposition of real property related thereto,

Community District 4, Borough of the Bronx, in accordance with Map No. 13115 dated September 22, 2005 and signed by the Borough President.

The application (C 060057 MMX) for an amendment to the City Map was filed by the Department of Parks and Recreation, pursuant to Sections 197-c and 199 of the New York City Charter on August 9, 2005. It involves: the establishment of a park between Major Deegan Boulevard and the Harlem River; and any acquisition or disposition of real property related thereto.

RELATED ACTIONS

In addition to the amendment to the City Map which is the subject of this report, implementation of the applicant's proposal also requires action by the City Planning Commission on the following applications which are being considered concurrently with this application:

BACKGROUND

The applicant proposes an amendment to the City Map involving the establishment of a park between Major Deegan Boulevard and the Harlem River; and any acquisition or disposition of real property related thereto.

An interagency mapping conference was held on August 25, 2005 and no city agency had any objections to this proposal.

A full background discussion and project description appears in the report on the related application for amendment of the City Map (C 060059 MMX).

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This application (C 060057 MMX), in conjunction with the applications for the related actions (C 060056 MMX, C 060058 MMX, C 060059 MMX, C 060144 PQX, C 060145 PPX, C 060146 PPX, C 060147 PPX, C 060148(A) MCX, C 060149 ZSX, C 060150 ZSX) was reviewed pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and the SEQRA regulations set forth in Volume 6 of the New York Code of Rules and Regulations, Section 617.00 et seq. and the City Environmental Quality Review (CEQR) Rules of Procedure

of 1991 and Executive Order No. 91 of 1977. The designated CEQR No. is 05DPR006X. The lead agency is the Department of Parks and Recreation.

A summary of the environmental review and the Final Environmental Impact Statement appears in the report on the related application for amendment of the City Map (C 060059 MMX).

UNIFORM LAND USE REVIEW

This application (C 060057 MMX), in conjunction with the applications for the related actions (C 060056 MMX, C 060058 MMX, C 060059 MMX, C 060144 PQX, C 060145 PPX, C 060146 PPX, C 060147 PPX, C 060148 MCX, C 060149 ZSX, C 060150 ZSX), was certified as complete by the Department of City Planning on September 26, 2005, and was duly referred to Community Board 4 and the Borough President, in accordance with Article 3 of the Uniform Land Use Review Procedure (ULURP) rules.

Community Board Public Hearing

Community Board 4 held a public hearing on this application (C 060057 MMX) on November 22, 2005, and on that date, by a vote of 16 to 8 with 5 abstentions, adopted a resolution recommending disapproval of the application.

A summary of the recommendation of Community Board 4 appears in the report on the related application for amendment of the City Map (C 060059 MMX).

Borough President Recommendation

This application (C 060057 MMX) was considered by the Bronx Borough President who issued a recommendation approving the application with conditions on December 22, 2005.

A summary of the Borough President's recommendation appears in the report on the related application for amendment of the City Map (C 060059 MMX).

City Planning Commission Public Hearing

On December 19, 2005 (Calendar No. 11), the City Planning Commission scheduled January 11, 2006 for a public hearing on this application (C 060057 MMX). The hearing was duly held on January 11, 2005 (Calendar No. 39) in conjunction with the hearing on the related actions (C 060056 MMX, C 060058 MMX, C 060059 MMX, C 060144 PQX, C 060145 PPX, C 060146 PPX, C 060147 PPX, C 060148(A) MCX, C 060149 ZSX, C 060150 ZSX).

There were a number of appearances, as described in the report on the related application for amendment of the City Map (C 060059 MMX) and the hearing was closed.

Waterfront Revitalization Program Consistency Review

This application (C 060057 MMX) was reviewed by the Department of City Planning for consistency with the policies of the New York City Waterfront Revitalization Program (WRP), as amended, approved by the New York City Council on October 13, 1999 and by the New York State Department of State on May 28, 2002, pursuant to the New York State Waterfront Revitalization and Coastal Resources Act of 1981 (New York State Executive Law, Section 910 et seq.). The designated WRP number is 05-056.

This action was determined to be consistent with the policies of the New York City Waterfront Revitalization Program.

CONSIDERATION

The City Planning Commission believes that this amendment to the City Map is appropriate.

A full consideration of the issues and the reasons for approving this application appears in the report on the related application for amendment of the City Map (C 060059 MMX).

RESOLUTION

Therefore, the City Planning Commission, deeming the proposed amendment to the City map and any related acquisition or disposition to be appropriate, adopts the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that having considered the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS), for which a Notice of Completion was issued on February 10, 2006, with respect to this application (CEQR No. 05DPR006X), the City Planning Commission finds that the requirements of Part 617, State Environmental Quality Review, have been met and that, consistent with social, economic and other essential considerations:

- 1. From among the reasonable alternatives thereto, the Alternative Park Plan set forth in the FEIS is the one which minimizes or avoids adverse environmental impacts to the maximum extent practicable; and
- 2. The adverse environmental impacts revealed in the FEIS with respect to the Alternative Park Plan will be minimized or avoided to the maximum extent practicable by incorporating as conditions to the approval those mitigative measures that were identified as practicable.

The report of the City Planning Commission, together with the FEIS, constitutes the written statement of facts, and of social, economic and other factors and standards, that form the basis of the decision, pursuant to Section 617.11(d) of the SEQRA regulations; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the City Planning Commission, in its capacity as the City Coastal Commission, has reviewed the waterfront aspects of this application and finds that the proposed action is consistent with WRP policies; and be it further

RESOLVED, by the City Planning Commission, pursuant to Sections 197-c and 199 of the New York City Charter, that based on the environmental determination and the consideration described in this report, the application (C 060057 MMX) for the amendment of the City Map involving: the establishment of a park between Major Deegan Boulevard and the Harlem River; and any acquisition or disposition of real property related thereto, in Community District 4, Borough of the Bronx, in accordance with Map No. 13115 dated September 22, 2005 and signed by the Borough President, is approved.

All such approvals are subject to the following condition:

The subject amendment to the City Map shall take effect on the day following the day on which certified counterparts of Map No. 13115 are filed with the appropriate agencies in accordance with Section 198 subsection c of the New York City Charter.

The above resolution, duly adopted by the City Planning Commission on February 22, 2006 (Calendar No. 8), is filed with the Office of the Speaker, City Council and the Borough President, in accordance with the requirements of Section 197-d of the New York City Charter.
